Actively involved in the live music scene, Ross fronts Highland based Hip Hop outfit Spring Break, who won the "Best Hip Hop" category at 2015's SAMA awards.





Jenny Lindsay is one of Scotland's best-known spoken word performers. Her spoken word, theatre and music organisation, Flint and Pitch, was included in The List Magazine's Hot 100 for 2017. As an independent programmer and promoter of poetry, live literature and spoken word, Jenny has been credited with contributing to a thriving live poetry scene in Scotland. In December 2017 she was awarded the Creative Edinburgh Award for Leadership for her work in the spoken word sector.

Joined by Steve Bull - Steve is a sound engineer and will work with young people to record what they produce.
